## **Transparency Statement for Using Emergency Retention Mechanism**

The University of Guelph plans to nominate an individual to an upcoming Tier 2 Canada Research Chair vacancy using the CRC Emergency Retention Mechanism. This statement is posted to fulfill the requirements of the Canada Research Chairs Program. (See <u>Requirements</u> for recruiting and nominating Canada Research Chairs).

The emergency retention mechanism is being used to retain a faculty member who has received a competing offer. The allocation of this Tier 2 CRC is in support of the University's <u>Strategic Research Plan</u>, specifically its continuing investment in the signature area of Data science and informatics.

In accordance with the University's <u>Policies for Management of Canada Research Chairs</u> <u>Allocation</u>, the request to use the emergency retention mechanism was reviewed by the University's CRC Advisory Committee. Following its review, it recommended to the Provost and the Vice-President (Research) that the nomination be approved to move forward.

The University of Guelph continues to track and monitor equity targets for its CRC allocation. The utilization of this Tier 2 CRC does not disrupt the University's ability to meet its equity targets by December 2019.
