Doing Indigenous Research: A Collaborative Project on Ethics Review between the Ontario Federation of Indigenous Friendship Centres and the University of Guelph

Guiding Questions for Indigenous Research

BEFORE RESEARCH BEGINS

- 1. What is the positionality of the researcher(s)? Are their connections to the research project clear?
- 2. Has the research developed a relationship with the participant(s)/community(s)/ environment(s) prior to starting the project?
- 3. Have the proper agreements, applications, and understandings been pursued based on what the research community has voiced?
- 4. Are the benefits to participants and community relevant, evident, and centralized? Have these benefits come from participants and communities themselves?

DURING RESEARCH

- 1. Are the benefits of the project (as indicated by the community) being prioritized?
- 2. How are responsibilities to research participants, communities and environments being upheld throughout the research process?
- 3. Is consent ongoing?
- 4. Is collaboration with the research participants and/or communities ongoing and community-based?

AFTER RESEARCH

- 1. Does ownership of data fall with research participants and/or communities?
- 2. Where is the data housed after the project is complete?
- 3. How does the researcher stay connected to the research participants, communities, and environments after the project is complete?

PARTING QUESTIONS

- 1. Why is it important to prioritize benefits to participants/community within Indigenous research? In what ways can this be seen in practice?
- 2. Why is it integral to uphold the principle of responsibility within Indigenous research instead of utilizing a risk-based perspective?
- 3. What is the significance of encouraging and supporting Indigenous research within the University of Guelph?
