Program

This MSc program is available as a thesis option, major paper option, or course only option. The intensive (6 semester) program is accredited by the Canadian Institute of Planners.

Research Fields

The program combines research, experiential learning and active involvement with faculty in order to create a stimulating learning environment in Canadian and International Planning and Development Fields.

Admission Requirements

The minimum requirement for admission is a four-year Honours degree (or equivalent) with an average of at least second class honours (B-) in the last four semesters (or two years) of study.

Application Deadline:

Departmental review of applications is completed by March 31, 2018.

After that date, admission will be based on availability of space.

Our faculty are widely recognized for both their leadership in the profession and their contributions to the communities they serve. They practice planning and development both in Canada and internationally.

The School of Environmental Design and Rural Development is unique in Canada in that it houses three closely related programs; Rural Planning and Development, Landscape Architecture and Capacity Development and Extension.
